- *U.S. Census and Maryland Department of Planning Estimation Data:*
 - Between July 2012 and July 2016, the Baltimore City population (ages 11-17) decreased 20.4% (from 60,124 to 47,864).
- *Intake Case Forwarding Decisions (FY 2017):*
 - 82.1% of complaints were formaeled while 6.6% were informed.
- *Intake Trends (FY 2015-2017):*
 - Total complaints decreased 34.9%
 - Percent of committed dispositions increased from 8.9% to 11.6%
 - Percent of probation dispositions decreased from 20.7% to 18.4%
- *Time Frames - Averages (FY 2017):*
 - Time from offense to intake referral date was 24.0 days.
 - Time from intake referral date to case forwarding decision was 8.6 days.
 - Time from case forwarding decision to sustained adjudication was 61.4 days.
- *Racial and Ethnic Disparity (FY 2017):*
 - Youth of color are most over-represented in Referral to Juvenile Court/Intake (3.99), Petition (1.10), and under-represented at Probation (0.76).

- *Offense Category for Intake Cases (FY 2016-2017):*
 - The percentage of Crimes of Violence increased from 25.8% to 30.8%
 - The percentage of Felonies increased from 26.5% to 29.0%
 - The percentage of Misdemeanors decreased from 45.9% to 39.1%

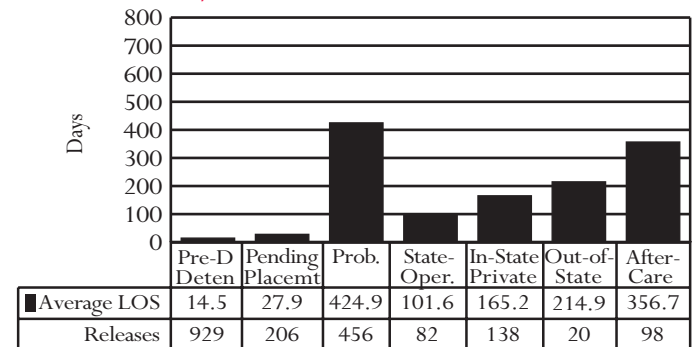
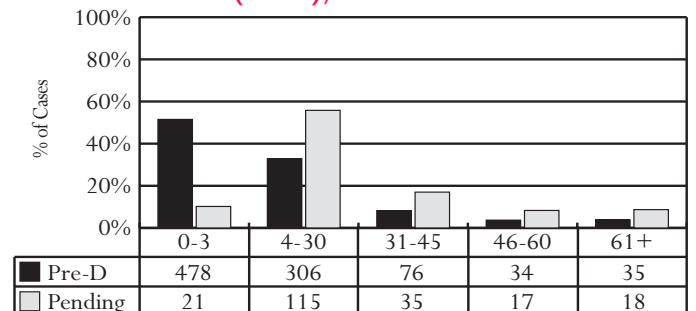
